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Plugin Overview

The plugin helps you to quickly protect your download pages from being Illegally shared + it also protects them from being indexed by search engines like Google, Yahoo, Bing and others.

It's a quick protection that you can easily add to these pages and it works with both WordPress Pages and Posts.

Installing The Plugin.

Installing the plugin is like installing any other WP plugin.

Step 1: Go to the "Plugins" section and click.

Step 2: Click "Add New" and Upload the included zip file.

Step 3: Activate it.

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Using The Plugin.

Using the plugin is really easy.

First, create a wordpress page / post (or edit an existing one).



At the end of the document, you'll see a "This banner will be seen by those visitors who spend 30 seconds or more on this post."

Step 2: Enable The Protection For Your Page / Post.

Step 4: Publish your Page/Post and add the security Key at the end it (at the end of the url of your page of post).

For example, if your download page is...

<http://www.yoursite.com/mydownloadpage>

And your secret key is ...

?epk=TJeAOA04PKMmCx1wqPH9YXimsLKICAxIFhEOkbyeO8bbQu

...

Your final url will be....

<http://www.yoursite.com/mydownloadpage?epk=TJeAOA04PKMmCx1wqPH9YXimsLKICAxIFhEOkbyeO8bbQu>

That full url, is the url that you have to use as your "Thank You" or "Download Page" in PayPal, JVZoo, WarriorPlus, ClickBank or other Platforms.



Now, When Someone Purchases Your Product...

When someone purchases your product, the system will validate the key that's passed by your payment processor (and which will be automatically removed from the url - the user won't see that key in the url bar of his browser).

If the key is valid, the customer will be cookie'd and will be able to access to that post/page (now and in the future).

Other users won't be able to access.

Final Comments

The system works with cookies, which means that (if the user deletes the cookies, he won't be able to access to his download page).

This is why, it's a good idea to be polite with the message that you use in the redirect url that you use for non-authorized users.

It's a good idea to use that page to:

- Enter your email for support (or your support desk).
- If you're using WarriorPlus / JVZoo, you can tell your visitors that they can access again to the download page by going to their "My Purchases" link.
